Notes	<p><i>Chapter 67.3(1)(d) Housing Facilities</i></p> <p><i>d. Indoor and outdoor housing facilities shall at all times be provided with ventilation by means of doors, windows, vents, air conditioning or direct flow of fresh air that is adequate to provide for the good health and comfort of the animals. Such ventilation shall be environmentally provided so as to maintain adequate temperature and minimize drafts, moisture condensation, odors or stagnant vapors of excreta. Auxiliary ventilation, such as fans, blowers or air conditioning, must be provided when the ambient temperature is above 85°F. Relative humidity must be maintained at a level that ensures the health and well-being of the animals housed in the housing facility. Indoor housing facilities must be capable of the following: (1) Maintaining humidity levels between 30 percent and 70 percent; and (2) Rapidly eliminating odors from within the building.</i></p> <p><i>[Inside building 1 there is a strong odor of dog waste. The doors are open for ventilation, but was not allowing enough fresh airflow to prevent the odor of waste.]</i></p>

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	Notes	<p><i>Chapter 67.3(1)(f) Housing Facilities</i> <i>f. Ceilings, walls and floors shall be constructed so as to lend themselves to efficient cleaning and sanitizing. Such surfaces shall be kept in good repair and maintained so that they are substantially impervious to moisture. Floors and walls to a height of four feet shall have finished surfaces. No sharp or jagged edges may be present that may injure an animal. Animal contact surfaces must be free of excessive rust that prevents required cleaning and sanitizing or that affects the structural strength of the surface or that may be detrimental to the health of the animal.</i></p> <p><i>[Floors in building 1 appear to be laminate/ wood particle click together flooring. The flooring is in disrepair with large portions of particle board exposed. The damaged flooring is not impervious to moisture and was wet. The floor damage is throughout building one. Building 2 has a cement floor that is unsealed and not impervious to moisture.]</i></p>

	Notes	<p><i>Chapter 67.3(1)(l) Housing Facilities</i> <i>l. Outdoor dog runs and exercise areas shall be of sound construction and kept in good repair so as to safely contain the animal(s) therein without injury. Floors shall be concrete, gravel or materials which can be regularly cleaned and kept free of waste accumulation. Grass runs and exercise areas are permissible provided that adequate ground cover is maintained, holes are kept filled and the ground cover is not allowed to become overgrown. Dog runs and exercise areas utilizing wire floors are permissible provided that the wire floors are not injurious to the animals and are adequately maintained. Wire flooring cannot cause injury to any animal contained in a dog run or exercise area that has wire flooring and must: (1) Have a solid resting surface of adequate size for an animal to lay on its side; (2) Be in good repair, free of excessive rust that prevents required cleaning and sanitizing or that affects the structural strength of the surface or that may be detrimental to the health of the animal; (3) Be free of jagged or sharp edges, and constructed so as to lend itself to efficient cleaning and sanitizing; and (4) Be of a gauge and construction to prevent bending and sagging and to prevent physical harm to an animal or entrapment of the feet of an animal housed within the primary enclosure.</i></p> <p><i>[Inadequate ground cover in outdoor pen with golden puppies.]</i></p>

	Notes	<p><i>Chapter 67.3(1)(i) Housing Facilities</i> <i>i. Equipment shall be available for removal and disposal of all waste materials from housing facilities to minimize vermin infestation, odors and disease hazards. Drainage systems shall be functional to effect the above purposes.</i></p> <p><i>[Drainage system in building 1 backs up on the northwest corner of the building. The pool attracts flies and other biting insects. The pool of waste water is approximately 10 feet from the outdoor primary housing runs of building 1.]</i></p>

Chapter 67.3(2)(a) Primary Enclosures

a. Primary enclosures shall be of sound construction and maintained in good repair to protect the animals from injury. No sharp points or jagged edges may be present that may cause injury to an animal. Animal contact surfaces must be free of excessive rust that prevents required cleaning and sanitizing or that affects the structural strength of the surface or that may be detrimental to the health of the animal. Animal contact surfaces must also be free of jagged edges, sharp points and anything that may cause injury to an animal. [Screws protruding through the top of the dog house in primary enclose of building 1. Outdoor run on southwest corner. Pen 9 and 13 in building 1 had wires protruding into the primary enclosures. The wires are being used to hold the auto feeders to the door of the enclosures. Rust on post inside primary enclosure of outdoor run on west side of building . In building 2 all of the slates in the primary enclosures are space to far apart. The enclosures in building 2 house small breed dogs. The dog's feet can go through the slates in the floors of their runs.]

Chapter 67.3(2)(b) Primary Enclosures

b. Construction materials and maintenance shall allow the animals to be kept clean and dry. Walls and floors shall be impervious to urine and other moisture and lend themselves to efficient cleaning and sanitizing. [Outdoor runs in building 1 are constructed of a cement floor and cinder block walls up 2 feet. The cinder block and the cement floors are unsealed and not impervious to moisture. Unsealed wood 2x6x10 along fence of outdoor run with golden puppies.]

Chapter 67.4(2)(a) Cleaning & Sanitation

a. Housing facilities and primary enclosures shall be cleaned a minimum of once in each 24-hour period and more frequently as may be necessary to reduce disease hazards and odors. Dirt, hair, excreta (including but not limited to urine and feces), food waste, and other debris shall be removed from a primary enclosure daily or at a frequency to prevent their accumulation and the contamination of the animals contained within the primary enclosure. [Building 1 has a strong odor of animal waste. Inside building 1 the floor was dirty with animal waste, food, and bedding chips.]

All dogs and cats taken into the care of a dealer, or transported into housing facilities regulated under Iowa Code chapter 162, excluding pounds and animal shelters, shall have been vaccinated against distemper, parvo and rabies, unless exempted by direct written recommendation of the owner's veterinarian or exempted by Iowa Code section 351.42 before entering the housing facility or being taken into the care of a dealer. Rabies titers shall not be accepted by a commercial establishment in lieu of a rabies vaccination. [No records for distemper or parvo vaccinations for any adult dogs at the facility. Hand written kennel cards of distemper and parvo for some puppies.]</i>
